| <b>Amy Wuest</b>                                   | <p>Amy Wuest gave presentation on the intersection of housing, homelessness, and mental and the development of systemic solutions to proactively address this intersect. Collaboration efforts of community partners started with a community health needs assessment targeting the ALICE population which is about 40% in our region looking at both what is limiting access to health and what is promoting access to health. Key themes that were found through analysis of the assessment: transportation, mental health/chronic stress, housing, and income. This shows a complex interwoven life experience.</p>   |                                  |             |

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| <b>Amy Wuest</b> | <p>The intervention has three components this presentation highlights the transportation component. This transit pilot project is called Ride United. Three components: education and access for using public transit within Pocatello, partnership with SHUDL for medical treatment needs and partnership with Door Dash for delivery of food boxes. This pilot started in December 2022 utilizing the Free Clinic as an access point. The desired outcome is that most non-profits in southeastern Idaho region will eventually have access to Ride United. 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| <b>TerriAnn Ness-Parker<br/>Dustin Parks</b> | <p>The Region 7 Behavioral Health Board, in partnership with Drift Net Inc., have combined efforts to host a proactive training for school safety by discussing “best-practice” prevention and preparedness strategies for safe learning environments. This all-day event is scheduled for October 6, 2023, featuring 5 different speakers. This date also coincides with an east Idaho wide teacher in service day, as education professionals are the targeted audience. This presentation has been in February in the Boise area. Presentation continued to outline the venue, target audience, in-person and virtual attendance. There was also a request of funding for this event given to board members.
